
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Thursday, February 1st to Thursday, February 8th, 2024, among a sample of 679 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in South Carolina. The survey was conducted using text message survey of registered voters and an online panel of registered voters, so a margin of error cannot be assigned. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in South Carolina.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3.8% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.











Do you think the 2024 Presidential election will be between Joe Biden and Donald Trump, or do you think it will involve different candidates? (all voters)














